

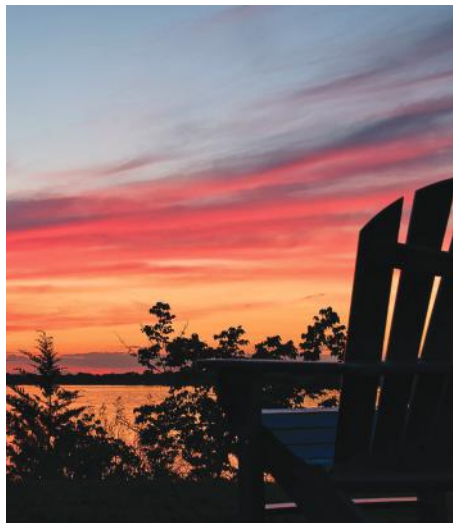

Dear Friends,

As we begin 2022 facing extraordinary new trials around the world, especially the war in Ukraine, we continue to feel gratitude for you, and all who gave generously to meet the opportunities and challenges of 2021.

MCF donors and fundholders continued to be a force for good in the world through their optimism, compassion and commitment. Together we had a remarkable year — particularly as we worked to address the ongoing effects of COVID-19, the marginalization of some of our neighbors and friends, and the impact of climate change. Thank you for your generosity.

While 2021 challenged us in many ways, we see opportunities for hope. In 2021, grants and distributions by MCF and our fundholders exceeded \$33 million. MCF assets climbed to nearly \$391 million because of strong donations (\$20.7 million) and excellent investment returns (20%).

Locally, we have continued to use the dollars you entrust to us in meaningful ways through our grantmaking programs. For example, together with the Community Foundation for the Fox Valley Region we co-funded efforts by Gathering Waters that yielded the bipartisan renewal of the Knowles-Nelson Environmental Stewardship Fund, and doubled its resources from \$64 million to \$132 million.

We also supported the installation of a statue on Wisconsin's capitol grounds in tribute to the Honorable Judge Vel Phillips. This was another bipartisan effort that recognizes a woman of many firsts, making her the first African American woman to be honored in this manner in any state capitol.

We are gratified by the many ways people came together for good in 2021. Thank you.

Giving Back, a Way of Life

For Cathy and Ralph Middlecamp, giving back to their community is a way of life. “It is a core value of ours to take what we need, but not be extravagant,” Cathy explained. This allows them to make charitable gifts to causes they care about.

Cathy, originally from Queens, New York, met Ralph at UW-Madison when she attended graduate school in the 1970s. They married and settled down in Madison to pursue their careers, Cathy as a lecturer in the UW-Madison Chemistry Department, and Ralph as an executive with St. Vincent de Paul.

Honoring Their Son Through Giving

The Middlecamps lost John, their only child, to childhood leukemia in the 1990s. Both Cathy and Ralph wanted to honor his memory, so it felt right to create a fund named after him with MCF.

Today, the John Middlecamp Memorial Fund supports places John cared about, including Red Caboose, his daycare center, the Baraboo Range, where he loved playing in the woods with his friends, and Holy Wisdom Monastery, where he is buried.

“Having these conversations about the fund has helped us remember John,” said Cathy. “It keeps bringing him back to us — we didn’t expect that.”

Because the John Middlecamp Memorial Fund is designated to support specific organizations, Cathy and Ralph can grow the fund by making qualified charitable distributions from their individual retirement accounts. “It doesn’t ever come into our taxable income, so it’s a sensible way to make donations,” Ralph observed.

A Second Fund Supports Current Passions

In late 2021, the couple established a second permanent fund — the Cathy and Ralph Middlecamp Fund — which supports some of their current passions, including the local and national councils of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, The Nature Conservancy, the UW Nelson Institute for Environmental Studies, and causes that benefit women and girls in our community through MCF’s A Fund for Women.

Cathy and Ralph take a long-term perspective on their philanthropy and have named each of their funds as beneficiaries in their estate plan. Their endowments at Madison Community Foundation are a permanent legacy for their family — a way to benefit the causes that are meaningful to them for generations to come.

Advising Charitable Givers on “Why” and “How”

When Cymbre Van Fossen was an English major at Amherst College, she wrote her thesis on metaphor in the poetry of Emily Dickinson. “That just shows you never know where life is going to take you,” she remarked. Today, Cymbre is a Senior Vice President at First Business Bank, where she is director of fiduciary services for the Private Wealth division.

Succession Planning and Philanthropy

For many of First Business Bank’s clients, philanthropy and succession planning go hand in hand. Some come in knowing their charitable goals. Others put off more comprehensive estate and legacy planning for a future date.

Regardless of where they started, when a business owner comes into significant wealth, plans can change. “When a business owner sells their business, that’s often when we start to have conversations about ‘what does effective legacy planning look like for you’ and ‘if the business isn’t the thing your family has in common, what is?’” observed Cymbre. “I definitely think philanthropy can be part of the answer.”

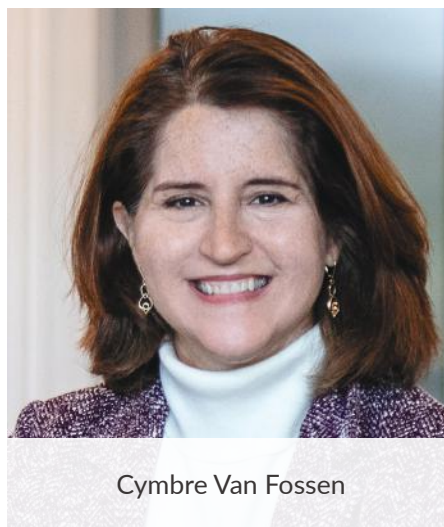
MCF Can Simplify Giving

Cymbre and her team often partner with other advisors to meet their clients’ goals. Cymbre said, “I find MCF is a strong option for a lot of families.” The bank’s wealth advisors appreciate the structure, advice, resources and ease of administration MCF provides.

When a client managing his own scholarship fund mentioned that the process of doing so had become stressful to him, Cymbre suggested he speak with MCF. “With MCF administering his fund, he was able to start with modest seed money and increase his gifts over time,” Cymbre recalled. “Now he’s seeing the fruits of that giving.”

Learning and Volunteering

When MCF launched its Chartered Advisor in Philanthropy (CAP) study group, Cymbre joined the inaugural cohort. “I was intrigued by the idea of deepening my knowledge of philanthropy,” she said.

“We look to be creative planners with our clients. I wanted to get a more comprehensive sense of all the options.”

The CAP study group has prompted Cymbre to think about her advising differently. “I’ve always been oriented towards technical solutions — the ‘how’ of tax efficient gift and estate planning. This course of study has prompted me to think more deeply about the ‘why’ that motivates the giving in the first place. I’m looking forward to having deeper and more impactful conversations about philanthropy with my clients and their families,” she reflected.

In addition to her work at First Business Bank, Cymbre is the Treasurer and a board member of Positive Women for Change, a Madison-area nonprofit that provides financial literacy and personal coaching services to women who have faced trauma or adversity with negative effects on their household finances. And in her spare time, she still enjoys reading great literature.

Removing Barriers

Cheri Teal’s Legacy Will Help Increase Access for People

Growing up, Cheri Teal’s parents didn’t have much money. Her father was unable to work because of his physical disabilities, which were caused by an accident. Her mother never finished high school and had limited job options. But despite these hardships, her family found ways to give back.

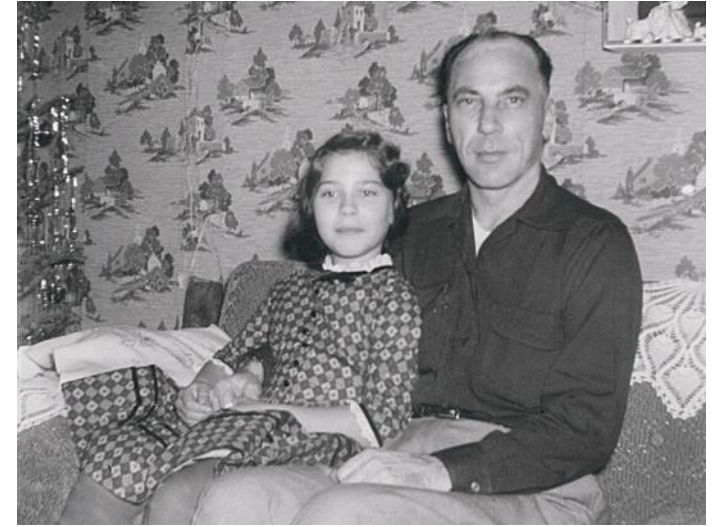
“I grew up with very limited financial means,” Cheri explained, “but the idea of giving to others was instilled in me at a young age. We donated toys and clothes to people who were less fortunate than we were. Giving back to the community that I live in continues to be important to me.”

Cheri has continued to give back to the community, both with financial gifts and as a volunteer. But Cheri’s philanthropic plans don’t stop there. “I think if you support certain areas during your lifetime, you should consider supporting them in your estate planning,” Cheri explained. Because she has no children or siblings, the idea of leaving her estate to support areas she felt were important seemed natural.

“I’d been aware of MCF and its role in the community for a long time,” Cheri said. “And the idea of MCF investing the money, letting it grow, while financially supporting a certain area seemed like a good fit with one of my goals.”

Those goals include helping people with physical disabilities participate fully in life. To do that, she created the Uncle Louie Fund for the Physically Disabled, named for her father.

“I had many cousins, and they called my dad ‘Uncle Louie.’ When I think about him, what comes to mind are my cousins talking about ‘Uncle Louie’ and their fond memories of him,” Cheri recalled.



“There were so many things my dad was not able to experience when I was a child because of his disability. He couldn’t attend my first communion, or choir concerts, or high school graduation because he was not able to get into the buildings.”

While the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act in 1990 removed the physical barriers to access in most public places, other types of access can still be harder to find.

“My dad loved to hunt and fish. But he had to figure out ways to do those things on his own,” Cheri said. “If someone wants to fish, they should be able to have access to places where they can fish. Most of us have the privilege of being able to go to the park and play. Why not make more recreational activities be available to everyone?”

The Uncle Louie Fund will help remove barriers and increase access for children and adults with physical disabilities. “Whether it’s a parent or a child, the repercussions of not being able to do things affects everyone. People should be able to participate in the activities they want to, regardless of their physical ability or age.”

A Legacy Gift Is an Expression of Hope for the Future

In 2021, in honor of MCF's Legacy Society members — people who have committed to leaving a gift to MCF in their will or estate plan — we made an investment in the future of our community's children.

Books in the home are the single biggest indicator of academic success, but two-thirds of children from low-income homes have no books to read. To help put more children on the path to academic success, together with Godfrey & Kahn, MCF made a \$10,000 gift to the Madison Reading Project. The books this gift provided will help sow the seeds for success for many children throughout the Madison area.

Thank you to our Legacy Society members for inspiring this investment in the future of our children, and for the many ways you strengthen our community.

Regional Giving Partners

Regional Giving Partners Support Their Communities

Our regional Giving Partners make incredible things happen in their communities. Each partner is represented by an advisory committee of residents from that community, which raises resources and recommends grants from their endowments. Regional giving partners work with MCF to maximize their earnings, secure principal and minimize administrative costs. You can learn more about the giving partners at madisongives.org/partners.

Columbus Area Endowment (CAE)

CAE works to enhance the cultural, educational and economic vitality of the community by supporting the well-being and quality of life of all its residents through both program and capital grants. In 2021, CAE awarded grants to five area organizations.

Lodi Area Community Endowment (LACE)

LACE works to preserve and enhance the community's cultural, educational and environmental gifts by providing resources for educational and civic projects within the boundaries of the School District of Lodi. In 2021, LACE awarded grants to seven area organizations.

Middleton Endowment (ME)

ME strives to enhance the quality of life for present and future generations in the Middleton area. ME focuses on supporting charitable activities that provide cultural enrichment, community development, education, and cultural and historic preservation. In 2021, ME awarded grants to eight area organizations.

The Monona Fund

The Monona Fund was established to benefit the community of Monona by supporting charitable causes that will build community spirit, preserve local history, support lifelong learning and education, and improve the quality of life for residents.



In 2021, CAE awarded a grant to the Savanna Oaks Community Center in support of its tree planting program.

Portage Area Community Fund (PACF)

PACF works to ensure that the Portage area will continue to build on its history by embracing the future. PACF focuses its grantmaking on civic and cultural enrichment, natural and historic preservation, parks and recreation, community development, youth and educational resources, and the needs of the community.

Rio Community Foundation

The Rio Community Foundation coordinates charitable giving in the Rio area by raising resources and encouraging support in education, agriculture and community development. In 2021, they made three grants in support of the Rio Community School District and the Public Library.

Bringing People Together to Support Women and Girls

In 1993, a group of 100 women came together to address what they felt was a lack of programs designed to benefit women and girls. From their initial gifts, A Fund for Women (AFFW) was born. Today, AFFW's mission is to transform Dane County so that all women and girls thrive. From that initial group of 100 women, AFFW has grown to include more than 2,500 supporters, and its endowment today is more than \$3.5 million. See page 23 for a list of AFFW's funds.

In 2021, AFFW made \$135,000 in grants to organizations supporting people who identify as women, helping them find economic stability for themselves and their families.

Centro Hispano

\$10,000 to provide services to undocumented and immigrant members of Madison's Latino community.

\$20,000 to provide employment training for Latinas wanting to pursue a career in finance or nursing, and to overcome barriers to advancing their careers through the Progreso program.

Domestic Abuse Intervention Services (DAIS)

\$10,000 to provide direct aid to women facing financial hurdles to leaving a domestic violence situation. This will help cover everything from housing stabilization and relocation expenses, to lock changes, legal expenses, prescriptions and transportation.

Freedom, Inc.

\$10,000 to continue to provide culturally specific healing spaces and community building and strengthening work in the LGBTQ+, Black and Southeast Asian communities in Dane County.

Latino Academy of Workforce Development

\$15,000 to provide individualized mentoring, education and career support for Dane County Latinas, including bilingual career training, Spanish GED classes and a Women in the Workplace Mentorship Program.

Omega School

\$20,000 for the BIPOC Mothers Virtual/Blended Program to help provide education support for young mothers looking to pursue their GED or HSED.



Domestic Abuse Intervention Services (DAIS)

Nationally, 98% of domestic violence survivors experience economic abuse, in which their partner controls access to economic resources or is able to prevent them from getting a job or education. In 2021, AFFW made a proactive grant to help provide funds to DAIS' clients to overcome these economic hurdles.

"We are deeply grateful for the support of A Fund for Women in helping us meet our clients' needs," said Shannon Barry, Executive Director at DAIS. "These resources increase a survivor's ability to support themselves and their families, increasing the likelihood of transitioning into lasting, secure situations."



UW Odyssey Project

\$20,000 to provide wrap-around support to Odyssey families who have been hard-hit by the pandemic — both economically and emotionally — by connecting them with rent assistance, organizations helping alleviate food insecurity and other resources.

The UW Odyssey Project's whole family approach has proven successful in helping students facing barriers to higher education start and sustain their educational paths. The program has empowered more than 500 low-income adults, predominantly women of color, to find their voice, develop a new sense of hope, and get a jump on earning college degrees.

The Road Home

\$10,000 to the Women's Employment & Training Fund to help women and their teenage daughters cover expenses such as childcare, car repair, testing fees, professional clothing and transportation that otherwise might stand in the way of their ability to work.

YWCA Madison

\$20,000 for the Empower Home program, which provides a safe transitional environment for people who are experiencing or are at risk of experiencing homelessness due to domestic violence or sexual assault.

Leveraging Our Community Impact Grantmaking for a Bigger Impact

In 2021, Madison’s nonprofit organizations continued to work in an environment shaped by the COVID-19 pandemic. MCF was able to invest in many projects and leverage millions of dollars in additional state and federal funding, which was critical to the long-term support and sustainability of the Dane County nonprofit ecosystem. Highlights included awarding a \$50,000 grant that helped leverage \$32 million a year in conservation funds for the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program, and distributing \$5 million in unrestricted COVID Recovery Grants on behalf of Dane County.

We also helped several organizations develop a pipeline of future talent – especially for people of color – through paid internship programs. Multiple organizations launched major capital campaigns to expand their facilities and grow their capacity and impact. Other organizations showed their dedication to protecting our natural resources through sustainable farming, environmental research and solar power. MCF was proud to invest in these efforts through our five Community Impact grant focus areas.

ARTS

From increasing diversity, to expanding rehearsal spaces and virtual teaching capacity, to building spaces for creative expression and joyful play, these arts organizations are developing capacity, fostering, and changing the arts landscape in our community.

Creating a New Center for Modern and Contemporary Dance

\$27,000 to Kanopy Dance Theatre to help fund its new dance center, which will incorporate state of the art equipment to support virtual programming.

Increasing Opportunities for Choreographers of Color

\$15,000 to Madison Ballet to expand opportunities for choreographers of color to build new works to add to Madison Ballet’s repertoire.

Expanding Wonderground

\$60,000 to Madison Children’s Museum to increase accessibility for visitors with limited mobility and add more complex play options for older children.



Building a Youth Music Center and Permanent Endowment

\$100,000 over two years to the Wisconsin Youth Symphony Orchestra for its capital campaign and a 1:2 endowment challenge match.

Creating a Youth Arts Center

Year three of a three-year, \$500,000 grant for the Madison Youth Arts Center to build the region's premier, collaborative youth arts space.

CAPACITY BUILDING

Capacity building efforts this year were all about leveraging additional dollars. Grants will help organizations build their internal capacity to increase fundraising, apply for federal support, and expand their facilities and programs.



Investing in Development Capacity

\$62,000 to The Foundation for Black Women's Wellness to create a full-time development position to build organizational capacity and stability.

Building a Safe, Strong, Sustainable Hub for Latino Families

\$100,000 over two years to Centro Hispano's "Campaign Centro," to help expand services for a rapidly growing community.

Expanding The Big Share Day of Giving

\$75,000 over three years to Community Shares of Wisconsin to help support and expand The Big Share online day of giving, leveraging millions of dollars in support for over 70 nonprofits.



Purchasing Land to Grow Produce for Food Pantries

\$36,000 to Madison Area Food Pantry Gardens to expand the Dane County EATS Healthy program.

Leveraging Federal Funding for Minority-Owned Businesses

\$50,000 to Scholz Nonprofit Law; \$28,000 to Madison Black Chamber of Commerce; and \$33,000 to the Latino Chamber of Commerce of Dane County to help build capacity and assist minority-owned businesses in applying for forgivable loans through the federal Paycheck Protection Program.

MCF Helps Dane County Award \$5 Million in COVID Recovery Grants

In early 2021, Dane County was allocated federal grant funds to help area nonprofits as part of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The County selected MCF to develop a \$5 million grant program for local nonprofits who experienced a financial impact from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Through the Dane County COVID Recovery Grant Program, MCF awarded grants ranging from \$2,500 to \$50,000 to 183 organizations working in Dane County. Priority was given to organizations that did not receive funding through the federal Paycheck Protection Program.

Funds were unrestricted so recipients could use them in the way that made the most sense for their organization, especially as so many had suffered adverse economic conditions during the pandemic.

The economic toll on the nonprofits that applied for grants varied greatly: two-thirds saw their budgets shrink in 2020, and 34% had to furlough staff. Nearly half the organizations ended 2020 with deficits ranging up to \$2.3 million.

Increasing Development Capacity

\$50,000 to REAP Food Group to increase its development capacity by training board members to actively participate in donor stewardship and fundraising, and hiring a grant writer.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Grants will help expand affordable housing, double the size of a community center, recognize an inspirational leader, improve our extraordinary park system, and facilitate a community planning process for one of the few public lakefront spaces left to develop.



Elevating Lives in the Bayview Community

\$100,000 over two years to the Bayview Foundation for its Bayview Rising campaign to replace the community's aging housing and build a new, larger Community Center.

Building More Accessible and Inclusive Playgrounds

\$30,000 to the Madison Parks Foundation to add three accessible playgrounds in Madison-area parks.

Supporting a Conceptual Planning Process

\$15,000 to Friends of San Damiano to begin the planning process to develop the San Damiano property on Lake Monona into a sustainable public asset.

Raising a Statue to Honor a Trailblazer

\$50,000 to the Boys & Girls Club of Dane County to help place a statue on the state capitol grounds of Vel Phillips, pioneering African American leader and jurist.

ENVIRONMENT

These grants invest in capacity building projects to further renewable energy sources, build a conservation career pipeline for diverse youth, increase scientific analysis, and leverage millions in state funding over the next four years for urban and rural land conservation projects.

Building a Conservation Career Pathway for People of Color

\$32,000 to Groundswell Conservancy to build a Conservation Graduate Crew with Operation Fresh Start, offering paid internships for youth of color and building a more diverse pipeline to conservation careers.

Integrating Climate-Driven Spatial Analysis Into Strategic Land Protection

\$20,000 to the Driftless Area Land Conservancy to develop a tool to use new science and data to better understand the region's conservation needs.



GATHERING SUPPORT FOR GREATER PUBLIC INVESTMENT IN NATURE

Madison Community Foundation awarded \$50,000 to Gathering Waters to lead statewide advocacy efforts to reauthorize and extend the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program. Since 1989, the Knowles-Nelson program has increased the public investment in preserving valuable natural areas and wildlife habitat, protected water quality and fisheries, and expanded opportunities for outdoor recreation.

The efforts were successful, garnering widespread bipartisan support, and the fund was extended for four years at \$32 million per year. This doubled the support provided in the previous renewal.

Many places across the state, especially in Dane County, have benefited from this program's funding — places like the Ice Age Trail, Cherokee Marsh and Troy Gardens. In Madison, Knowles-Nelson has provided \$7.1 million for urban parks like McPike Park, wetland restoration, bike trails and more. The renewal likely will bring an additional \$1.5 million a year of conservation funding to Dane County.

Building Science Capacity

\$10,000 to Clean Wisconsin to expand its summer science internship program into a year-round fellowship program.

Installing a Solar Energy System

\$35,000 to the Deerfield Community Center to install a solar energy system that supports their Food Pantry and Senior Center.

LEARNING

Grants focused on supporting after-school programming, creating career pipelines in journalism and library science, and facilitating the planning and building of major new facilities.

Providing School-Based Outreach Programs

\$30,000 to CEOs of Tomorrow to create real-world entrepreneurial and business-management learning opportunities for students in high-need area schools.

Expanding Youth Programming at a New Neighborhood Center

\$57,000 to the Vera Court Neighborhood Center to hire a Youth Program Director to build programs in preparation for a major capital campaign for the new Bridge Lake Point Waunona Neighborhood Center.

Helping Youth Learn Skilled Trades

\$20,000 to the Boys & Girls Club of Dane County toward the construction of the new McKenzie Skilled Trades Training Center.



Expanding Access to Black History for a New Day

\$150,000 over two years to Nehemiah to expand access to Black History for a New Day for school district employees, police departments and judicial leaders across the county.

Developing a Pipeline of Talent

\$20,000 1:1 matching grant to Dane County Library Services to help fund the Ripple Intern Program to recruit, train and employ youth of color in paid internships and encourage careers in library science.

Building Community Schools

Year three of a five-year, \$1.1 million challenge grant to the Madison Public Schools Foundation to grow and sustain the Madison Public School District's Community Schools Initiative.

Building a New Library to Serve a Growing Community

\$40,000 to Oregon Public Library toward its Capital Campaign to build a new, significantly larger library and greatly expand library services.

Celebrating 30 Years of Academic Achievement and Youth Leadership

\$18,000 to Simpson Street Free Press, which will celebrate its 30th anniversary by hiring six additional teen editors.



Expanding Learning Opportunities

\$10,000 to First Tee of South Central Wisconsin to expand four Learning Centers, creating room to work with 280 students from 10 Madison schools.

Sticking to Our Mission

In a year still challenged by COVID, when inflation started to take root and the Federal Reserve Board began to tighten monetary policy, both MCF permanent endowment portfolios performed exceptionally well. As you can see from the table below, both portfolios beat their benchmarks. The Diversified Portfolio also significantly outperformed our peer universe, which finished the year with a 16.73% return.

But the annual returns only tell part of our story, representing a moment in time rather than the infinite outlook we have for our investments. MCF’s investment strategy is intended to maximize long-term returns so that the money you give today will continue to support our community in perpetuity.

How do we do it?

It starts with our governing document. The MCF trust agreement is designed to protect the interests of our 900 fundholders — individuals and nonprofits — who invest with the foundation.

It dictates how we operate and requires court action to deviate from it. It guides our Board’s stewardship decisions and the fiduciary responsibilities of the Investment

Committee that oversees our investment programs and portfolio managers.

Boston Trust Walden (BTW) has managed our environmental, social and governance (ESG) portfolio for 30 years. BTW is an industry leader in ESG management and is focused on encouraging companies to adopt better ESG policies and practices, because evidence shows companies that prioritize ESG issues have superior long-term financial performance.

Commonfund serves as our outsourced chief investment officer (OCIO) and has directly managed our diversified portfolio since 2006. Commonfund is a nonprofit, mission-based investment firm that serves endowments and foundations rather than shareholders.

Our Investment Committee meets with managers quarterly to review performance, assess risk, analyze liquidity, and test the long-term sustainability of our investment goals. The Committee then reports back to the Board so that everyone is fully informed.

This multi-layered oversight is designed to ensure MCF continues to fulfill its promise to the community, as we have for the past 80 years.
