About the Cover

Madison's south side is experiencing a renaissance that is the culmination of many years of hard work by community leaders who had a vision for what could be, and have worked long and hard to bring it to fruition. Many of the organizations on the cover have worked together to provide a full range of services to area residents, and to develop spaces that celebrate Black and Hispanic culture and accomplishments.

Madison Community Foundation believes that the most effective way to bring meaningful, lasting change is by supporting ecosystems, which creates momentum in a way that discrete individual grants may not. This approach has worked well in neighborhoods across Madison, including those on the front and back cover of this report. Over the last 15 years, MCF has awarded more than \$3.5 million in grants from our Community Impact and Field of Interest grant funds to the following organizations along the Park Street corridor on Madison's south side. Our fundholders have distributed an additional nearly \$4.5 million to these organizations:

Dear Friends,

We are pleased to share Madison Community Foundation's Annual Report for 2022. We thank the many donors who give to and through MCF, and hope you are inspired by the stories that follow.

MCF donors and fundholders continue to respond to events in the world around us with compassion, determination and giving. In the following pages you will see that donors provided nearly \$28 million in contributions — most of that into endowments — and MCF and its fundholders made 1,904 grants totaling \$18.9 million to a wide array of nonprofit organizations. We are gratified by the many ways you joined us to enhance equity, promote sustainability and develop a more vibrant community.

MCF's Investment Committee, with its chief investment officer Commonfund, managed your gifts well. While ongoing economic and market conditions meant MCF's diversified portfolio closed the year down 8.7%, it outperformed both its benchmark (which was down 10.2%) and the S&P 500 (which was down 18.1%). In addition, MCF's Board of Governors implemented another reduction in the fee structure — ensuring more resources are available to distribute by fundholders annually.

As the cover of this report reflects, MCF believes in an ecosystem approach to meeting the needs of our community. We understand that funding specific nonprofits in isolation rarely produces the level of impact our community wants and needs. But funding several organizations in a similar geographic or philosophical sphere creates greater momentum as the next grant builds off the last grant.

MCF — together with many donors and foundations — has been investing in South Madison for decades. What looks like an overnight renaissance to some is actually the work of many people and organizations over years. United Way of Dane County has been part of this effort — and we were honored to sponsor their Centennial Celebration this past year as well. We share a vision with United Way that we can create a vibrant Greater Madison where everyone thrives. Indeed, we do that by harnessing the energy of many to work for all.

Donor Engagement

It is an honor for us to help people achieve their charitable goals, and this past year we welcomed 34 new fundholders and 10 new Legacy Society commitments. We were also humbled to receive nine estate gifts, including one that created an endowment for the International Crane Foundation.

In April, Camille Zanoni joined us as Director of Donor and Giving Partner Engagement. And in May people embraced the opportunity to reconnect in person, with a record turnout for our annual Madison Gives dinner. As the year drew to a close, we congratulated our first cohort of advisors who earned their Chartered Advisor in Philanthropy credential.

It was a busy and gratifying year — made more so by witnessing the generosity of so many in our community.

Helping Others “Dream Big and Dream Often”

As an educator, María del Rosario Covarrubias sought to instill in her students the belief that they were all scholars who could succeed, regardless of the hurdles they might face. She knew the power of education firsthand, because it was the path she took to achieve success.

Born in Guadalajara, Mexico, María faced a future of instability, poverty and gender discrimination. She bravely made her way to this country with a sixth-grade education and a fierce dream of a better life.



Giving in the Face of Adversity

María was diagnosed with interstitial pulmonary fibrosis in 2007. Despite a grim prognosis, “She wasn’t done,” her daughter Cindy Covarrubias shared. “Even in the hospital, she was continuing to learn and find ways to help others.”

It was from that desire the María del Rosario Covarrubias Educational Opportunity Fund was born in 2018. María wanted to continue giving, even after her death. When she learned she wouldn’t be able to be an organ donor, she thought that opportunity had been taken from her. But her friend Lesli Ann Vázquez Vargas suggested another option. The family could start a scholarship fund to keep María’s passion for helping others through education alive.

The idea of being able to continue helping others brought María incredible joy. Vázquez Vargas helped connect the family with MCF. “Mom had it all planned out within an hour,” her daughter Julie Rice said.

A Dream Realized

The Covarrubias fund started as an acorn fund, designed to grow over time until it is fully endowed. Thanks to the family's sustained fundraising, in 2022, the María del Rosario Covarrubias Educational Opportunity Fund became a fully endowed fund.



Karen Pérez-Wilson, who currently is attending law school at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, is a recent recipient of the Covarrubias Scholarship. "Without it, my attending law school would be nothing but a dream," Karen said. "I am inspired by Ms. Covarrubias' story and in many ways see parallels with mine. We both believe in the power of education and the importance of paying it forward by giving back to our community. I plan to keep her legacy alive by doing just that."

A Career Centered on His Clients' Needs

While he recently retired from full-time accounting at SVA Certified Public Accountants, E.G. Schramka still works with clients to help them achieve their goals, including through philanthropy. Joining MCF's second Chartered Advisor in Philanthropy (CAP) study cohort is a natural continuation of the way E.G. has always worked to understand how to meet his clients' needs.

Over the years, E.G. has earned an impressive string of professional designations — CPA, JD, ABV, CIRM, PFS. Each has helped him better understand how to serve his clients. The CAP program will take that one step further.

"The CAP group really talks about the 'why' of philanthropy: people's desire to leave an individual legacy or a family legacy," E.G. reflected. "It's interesting to be part of a collaboration of professionals from different areas of expertise talking together about what's best for the individual."

Tapping Into MCF's Knowledge

E.G. often refers clients to MCF. "You can look at the grants made and know MCF has done the due diligence and research about the different organizations," E.G. said. "If I had a client that wanted to start supporting a certain organization or type of organization, I would suggest they talk to someone at MCF."

"MCF also can help people explore the different types of giving vehicles, like donor advised, designated or field of interest funds, to help them determine which will help them have the greatest impact based on their goals, or help them develop plans to leave a charitable legacy through their estate."

Getting the Next Generation Involved

E.G.'s clients often turn to donor advised funds for their giving because of the relative ease they provide compared to a private foundation. They also appreciate the ease with which they could involve their children in their giving, by naming them as successor advisors to their donor advised funds.

"Naming successor advisors provides families with an opening to talk about philanthropy and giving. The second generation often doesn't have a lot of disposable income yet, because they're not established in their careers and personal lives. This provides a way for families to involve those children in discussions about the family's values and interests — another way to create a charitable legacy."

Planting Seeds For Future Generations

Many of Anne Iwata's early memories revolve around music and libraries: singing with her mother who played piano in Japanese internment camps. Listening to Louis Armstrong with her father. Enjoying music and tap dance lessons. Going to the library with her mother and sister and a red wagon. Exploring the world through books.

Anne and her husband Darren Stucker "met cute" at Madison's airport and traveled the world together. The couple shared a love of music and prioritized maintaining friendships and living life to its fullest. They often hosted guests and parties at their home and had joyous annual reunions with Darren's college friends at the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival.

Anne and Darren valued doing the right thing and working for social justice. They felt fortunate to live in Madison and made gifts to foster things that brought them fun and happiness. Darren was a filmmaker whose dream was to win the lottery and start a foundation to produce videos for causes he was passionate about.

"Philanthropy became more important to me after Darren died, because it is a way to remember him. Going through probate and settling an estate gives you a different perspective about what you want your legacy to be and how you want your money to be used," Anne shared.

Anne created the Anne Iwata and Darren Stucker Fund for Music Education and the Anne Iwata and Darren Stucker Fund (for libraries) at MCF to honor the values she and Darren shared and to support the causes that were important to them. She originally created the funds as part of her estate plan but decided to fund them during her lifetime to witness their impact today. "It's rewarding to watch the funds grow and touch the community. I want people to have access to the things that were important to Darren and me."

"Darren's company was called Appleseed Productions," Anne explained. "Starting the funds was like planting the seeds, and they are sprouting opportunities for the children at the libraries and the next generation of musicians."

Anne still makes weekly trips to the library, travels to see live music and dances any chance she gets.



Supporting Our Regional Communities

MCF's regional giving partners — **Columbus Area Endowment, Lodi Area Community Endowment, Middleton Endowment, The Monona Fund, Portage Area Community Fund** and **Rio Community Foundation** — are dedicated to keeping their communities vibrant. They partner with MCF to serve donors who support their communities, and award grants to fund schools, parks, community centers and local programs. Here are some examples of their work.

Columbus Area Endowment

The Columbus Area Endowment has been steadily growing its fund since it was established in 2008. In 2022, CAE awarded \$23,000 to eight community organizations. These grants helped support health, nutrition, learning and community development in the Columbus area. Two of the largest grants awarded in 2022 include \$4,900 for the Columbus Community Lunch For Kids Nutrition Program and \$4,000 for the Fall River High School Infant Simulator in its Family and Consumer Sciences Program.

Lodi Area Community Endowment

The Lodi Area Community Endowment was founded in 2009 to preserve and enhance the Lodi community's proud legacy of cultural, educational and environmental gifts, and to facilitate philanthropy in Lodi. In 2022, LACE awarded \$17,200 in grants to 11 local organizations; including Blessings in a Backpack, Ice Age Nordic Ski Club, Lodi Middle School Library and Reach Out Lodi.

Rio Community Foundation

The Rio Community Foundation focuses its grantmaking on meeting the current educational and community needs while building long-term support for the Rio School District. RCF supports five focus areas, each with its own fund, including community, library, athletic, agriculture and education. For example, in 2022, RCF awarded a grant to the Rio Music Department to purchase instruments for use by students who otherwise would be unable to participate in music lessons.

"We appreciate the ongoing support provided to our team from MCF. They provide us with professional development through their Giving Partner Retreats, which focus on topics such as infrastructure, accounting, investing, grant writing, fundraising, donor engagement, marketing, long-term planning and so much more!"

A Fund for Women

A group of 100 women came together in 1993 to encourage women in philanthropy, and to address the lack of programs designed to benefit women and girls. Together, they created A Fund for Women, an endowment fund focused on supporting women and girls in Dane County so they can reach their full potential.

With consistent growth through contributions and the earnings of the original \$100,000 in gifts, AFFW's Advisory Committee now grants more than \$100,000 each year to Dane County nonprofits that serve women and girls.

At the heart of AFFW's mission are fundraising and grantmaking. By providing a way for people to translate their passion, values and interest in women's well-being into action, AFFW's fundraising activities help build a culture of women's philanthropy.

Every year, guided by community needs and opportunities, AFFW's grantmaking supports proven and emerging programs with the potential to deliver the highest impact.

Money follows vision. A vision of extraordinary women 30 years ago burgeoned from \$100,000 to nearly \$4 million today. To all the supporters and fundholders who made this growth possible, thank you!

Economic security for families in Dane County happens when we invest in women — breaking the cycle of poverty and reducing barriers to success. Today we celebrate — both what we have accomplished together and what our future holds. When women thrive, everyone thrives!

Grants Made in 2022 to Support Women and Girls in Dane County

In 2022, AFFW awarded \$139,471 in grants to organizations supporting people who identify as women as they build economic stability for themselves and their families.

Bayview Foundation

\$15,000 to the Women's Advancement Planning Pilot team to identify the greatest needs for Bayview's women and girls to succeed.

Centro Hispano

\$23,000 to the Latinas in Savings Initiative, to help participants understand their finances, and to work with local credit unions to provide access to low- or no-cost savings accounts.

Foundation for Dane County Parks

\$21,711 to the Chainsaw Workshops for Women, to provide women with the knowledge, confidence and training for a career in natural resource management.

Latino Academy of Workforce Development

\$20,000 to the Advancing Latina Career Pathways program, expanding education and job training services through mentoring, Spanish-language GEDs and bilingual workforce training programs.

Friends of the UW Odyssey Project

\$26,260 for wraparound financial support for Odyssey students and their families so they can remain focused on their studies.

OutReach LGBTQ+ Community Center

\$3,500 to support transgender women by providing financial assistance for updating identification documents and purchasing gender-affirming clothing and accessories.

Progress Center for Black Women

\$20,000 to the Under One Roof program, offering immediate and long-term interventions for women and their families to receive counseling, education, coaching and other resources in one place.

With A Fund For Women's grant, the Bayview Foundation was able to hire a women's specialist, Tess Stroth. Since January, Tess has been working to build relationships with prominent female community members and has hosted meetings with residents.

The meetings have begun to solidify a group who will lead the initiative to determine how the fund can best be used to support women at Bayview.

Community Impact

In 2022 we expanded our team by welcoming Angela Davis and Jazzmine Haygood. Our increased capacity allowed us to better serve more than 300 nonprofit agencies that worked with us in 2022.

We also awarded 85 grants from our Community Impact and Field of Interest grantmaking programs — including several to support capital and endowment campaigns. Some of these grants continue to fuel the “South Madison Renaissance” — supporting visionary agencies that serve not only this neighborhood, but also Greater Madison, and in some cases communities across Dane County.

We see diversity, equity and inclusion not as a specific focus area, but as a lens through which we consider all grants — whether in the arts or environment; whether from our Community Impact or Field of Interest grantmaking programs. We hope this is evident in the grants that follow.

Enhancing Agency, Autonomy, and Self-Sufficiency

“Fascination” is the word Cooper Talbot uses to describe her feelings about Urban Triage, the organization she has volunteered with since its inception, and where she now works as Agriculture Lead.

Urban Triage began in founder Brandi Grayson’s living room. Grayson, born and raised in Madison, began her activism as a teenager, organizing protests and advocating for the rights of Black and marginalized communities. The idea to form an organization focused on supporting marginalized individuals’ agency, autonomy and self-sufficiency “came out of Brandi’s personal experience,” said Talbot, “as someone who had known foster care, who was a single mother, who needed resources and who recognized that she was not the only one with those needs.” Incorporated in 2018, the organization initially focused on supporting individuals and families facing barriers to accessing healthcare, education, housing and employment. Today, the organization is working to build an endowment to fund infrastructure and programming that will expand its work in our community even further.

Urban Triage’s programs and services include community outreach and engagement; educational workshops and training; mental health and wellness support; and advocacy for policies and practices that advance racial equity and social justice. The organization’s work is grounded in the principles of self-determination, collective responsibility and community empowerment.



Using Agriculture as Healing

Urban Triage's approach is rooted in partnerships. For its Supporting Healthy Black Agriculture program, it has partnered with the Farley Center for Peace, Justice & Sustainability. In this program, people find spiritual healing, healthy nutrition and transformative education while addressing health disparities in our community.

Each summer, a cohort of students spends 12 weeks at the Farley Center engaged in hands-on farming and trauma-informed education. These components work together to encourage healing, on and off the land. Produce from the program fills boxes for a community supported agriculture (CSA) program available to families at Urban Triage's South Madison location.

In addition to its direct services and advocacy work, Urban Triage is involved in broader community initiatives to address racial disparities. Now in the initial planning stages, its Unhoused Youth Initiative will bring housing and services under one roof for area youth who are between 17 and 24. "Our vision is that these young people are being prepared, spiritually and mentally, to be sitting in our seats, leading Madison-area advocacy in the future," Talbot said.



2022 Community Impact Grants

In 2022, MCF awarded more than \$1.2 million in grants to 18 local nonprofits. Several themes run through these grants, including a focus on diversity and inclusion, and investing in capital campaigns as organizations build capacity and improve their sustainability. Our 2022 awards also include MCF's largest endowment challenge grant.

\$75,000 to the Bayview Foundation (year two of a two-year, \$150,000 grant) to build a new community center and 200 units of affordable housing.

\$30,000 over two years to Black Girl Magic Educational Services to develop a mentorship program in schools, building confidence, creativity and success.

\$300,000 to Boys & Girls Clubs of Dane County to build an endowment for the McKenzie Regional Workforce Training Center, offering training in the building trades for local youth.

\$100,000 to The Center for Black Excellence and Culture toward the capital campaign for The Center, which will showcase Black art, history and innovation, and provide leadership development for all ages.

\$50,000 to Centro Hispano (year two of a two-year, \$100,000 grant) to help prepare for a major capital campaign that will increase usable space and expand programming to serve more families.

\$25,000 to Community Shares of Wisconsin (year two of a three-year, \$75,000 grant) to continue to expand and support The Big Share day of online giving.

\$30,000 to the Foundation for Dane County Parks to increase its fundraising capacity and ensure the organization's long-term impact and sustainability.

\$37,500 to the Goodman Community Center to support staff education around strategic fundraising as the Goodman Center approaches its 70th anniversary.

\$30,000 to Logan's Hearts & Smiles to increase staffing and build 200 accessibility projects for families with disabled children over the next five years.

\$40,000 to the Madison Public Market Foundation to support art at the Public Market, particularly works celebrating Madison's Indigenous, Black, Hmong and Latinx artists and communities.

\$40,000 to Madison Reading Project for the purchase of a larger, climate-controlled, lift-equipped Big Red Reading Bus, more than doubling its outreach and free book distribution across Dane County.

\$20,000 to Maydm to help build and diversify curriculum and programming in STEM education for young women, particularly women of color.

\$30,000 to Prairie Music & Arts to help expand and develop new culturally responsive programming in a growing school system.

\$75,000 to Rooted WI to increase staffing and strengthen its communications and development strategies, improving visibility, access and engagement.

\$150,000 to the Urban League of Greater Madison for the Black Business Hub and the Hub Accelerator Program, which will support Black entrepreneurship and increase job opportunities in Madison.

\$100,000 to Urban Triage to help build the organization's endowment, helping ensure sustainability of the organization and its many programs.

Finance and Operations

This year, the Finance and Operations team helped establish 34 new funds for community members, processed nearly \$28 million of gifts to funds at MCF, and helped make 1,904 distributions to organizations in our community and beyond. We continued to carefully steward the funds entrusted to MCF, working with our Investment Committee and Commonfund OCIO, which serves as MCF's chief investment officer.

In 2022, MCF's Investments Outperformed Their Benchmarks

For investors, 2022 was a year marked by investment market volatility and an end to a 10+ year bull market. Despite these challenging conditions, both of MCF's investment portfolios performed well relative to their respective benchmarks. (See the table below.)

MCF's diversified investment portfolio is managed by Commonfund, which also acts as MCF's Outsourced Chief Investment Officer (OCIO). Commonfund works closely with the MCF Investment Committee and staff to reach MCF's endowment stewardship goals, including investment policy review, portfolio construction, asset allocation and rebalancing, manager selection, and risk management assessment and reporting.

MCF's ESG (environmental, social and governance) portfolio is managed by Boston Trust Walden. Walden has been a leader in the social investing industry since 1975. Walden employs an activist-shareholder approach — using its leverage as a major shareholder in companies to file resolutions to bring about change within the company. It has engaged in this manner with 81% of the companies it is invested in, and has negotiated successful agreements with 48% of those companies.

Like the Park Street corridor featured on the front cover, East Washington Avenue has transformed over the past 15 years. Considering just the area between South Blair Street and South Baldwin Street one will find a thriving — and growing — hub of creativity. The mix of for-profit and nonprofit businesses is compelling. While MCF has invested in anchor nonprofit buildings such as MyArts and the Wisconsin Youth Symphony Orchestra, they exist alongside for-profit concert venues such as the Sylvie and Breese Stevens Field. This small ecosystem of East Washington Avenue is also home to organizations that support entrepreneurship and environmental conservation, and that provide workforce training and social services.
