2024 LACE Grants Total \$21,618 **Nine Area Groups Received Funding**



The Lodi chapter of Blessings in a Backpack seeks to provide students in need with nutritional food on weekends to improve their health and wellness and to show the children the community cares about them.

Habitat for Humanity Wisconsin River Area strives for a world where everyone has a decent place to live. This funding was used to address safety concerns in a 110-yearold home, including building a new accessibility ramp and Habitat or Humanity making critical repairs.



The Lake Melvin Yacht Club is a "neighbors helping" neighbors in need" program. They will use funding to help assist families in need. Assistance ranges from helping to pay for rent, fuel, electricity, and other dav-to-dav needs.

Lodi Wrestling Club is committed to helping each wrestler grow as an individual. Funding was used to purchase weights for the weight room at the Lodi Middle School.



Reach Out Lodi provides a welcoming community center where people can gather and a community store that assists those facing challenges in supporting their basic living needs. Funding was used toward "Social Sunday" featuring food and entertainment.



The Friends of Lodi Dog Park are dedicated to managing a play spot for our 4-legged friends. Funds will be used toward a new dog park in Lodi.

Ice Age Nordic maintains the free community ski trails and supports the development of Nordic Skiing grades 1-12. Funds were used for signage and storage building repairs.



The Okee Bay/Mill Pond Lake Association preserves and protects Okee Bay (Mill Pond) and its surroundings to enhance water quality. fishery. boating safety, and aesthetic value. Funds were used to address the invasive aquatic plants within DNR approved treatment areas.
